Pennsylvania Trauma Systems Foundation (PTSF)

Overview

The Pennsylvania Trauma Systems Foundation (PTSF) contracts with Digital Innovation, Inc (DI) to provide all necessary trauma registry software to all accredited trauma centers.

Digital Innovation, Inc. is committed to upgrading your PTOS Trauma Registry and all associated modules to implement the ICD-10 standard.

The following will be included in the upgrade:

- Underlying database structures will be modified to correctly store the different data types of the ICD-10 codes
- Both ICD-10 and ICD-9 data entry screen functionality
- Navigable and searchable menus for ICD-10 codes
- Best case mapping to ICD-10 from AIS 2005 in TriCode
- DI Report Writer augmented to support reporting of new ICD-10 fields
- NTDB and State Download formats capable of exporting ICD-10 fields

Other Important Points

- As an accredited trauma center with PTSF, there are no additional costs to PA trauma centers for the PA ICD-10 compatible software, as these efforts have been coordinated between PTSF and DI.
- The PTOS COLLECTOR 2015 and PTOS Report Writer 2015 version will support dual use of the ICD-9 and ICD-10 code sets.
- No new hardware requirements will be necessary to accommodate the ICD-10 compatible software.
- PTSF will partner with DI to provide education and training on the ICD-10 compatible software through various means throughout late 2013 and 2014.
- DI will work with each trauma center and plan for a managed installation of the upgrade. Trauma centers can begin scheduling installation appointments with the DI Support Team in December, 2014.
- If your trauma center has an existing hospital based trauma registry related import, interface or export that might need to upgrade to ICD-10, DI recommends you begin planning. As a first step, determine the impact by beginning conversations between your IT department, your Trauma Registry department and DI. If DI is required to make any changes, there may be an associated fee to your trauma center.

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Forecasted Timeline

PTSF and DI are working together to coordinate timelines and to define specific implementations and rollouts of ICD-10 that meet all needs. DI is currently on track to be ICD-10-CM/PCS compatible with the PTOS Trauma Registry software applications by the PTSF required date of January 1, 2015. The ICD-10 codes sets will be supported with the COLLECTOR 2015 version and the Report Writer 2015 version which are scheduled to be available in late December 2014.
